Being a Rotarian is more than just being a member of Rotary, Dist. Gov. Brady says

District 6080 Governor Andrea Brady paid her official visit to the Harrisonville club last week with a message about her three pillars of Rotary:

- Kindness matters
- Do good things
- You get what you give

There is a difference, Andrea said, between being a Rotarian and merely being a member of Rotary. "It's about showing up and doing the small things," she said. "We're better as Rotarians when we're doing things."

As an example, she recounted how getting involved in the Rock 'n' Ribs fundraiser in

Springfield completely changed her view of Rotary. All five of the Springfield clubs staged the annual barbecue fundraiser to benefit local charities. She got to know other Rotarians on a personal level and realized the power of Rotary to do good in the world.

"Kindness is the glue that holds us together," she said, "and kindness is catching."

Whether it's Rotary or life in general, it's true that you get what you give.

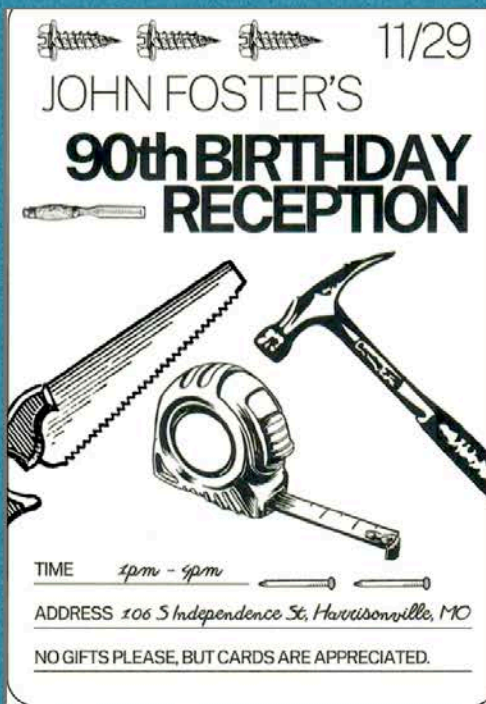
