PE teacher uses Bass Pro experience to start pool maintenance business

As many teachers do, T. J. Keeney found a second job for extra income, and in a few short years Keen Aquatics has turned into a growing business.

A guest of Jon Kling, T. J. spoke about the history of his business and some of the challenges it poses. "The biggest thing is (that) people get a pool and don't realize what's involved," he said.



Although he has a background in aquariums and water feature maintenance, he prefers doing swimming pool maintenance. In fact, 99% of his business is pools. Keen Aquatics serves communities as far north as Smithville and south to Adrian.

Most of his work involves residential pools but he is starting to do more commercial work and recently bid on a contract from a homeowners' association in Raymore.

T. J. says he started the business in 2024, and his work volume increased 50% in 2025. He is also looking at getting into pool inspections and pool liners. For now, most of his business is opening and closing pools and providing weekly or biweekly pool maintenance. Services can also include pool repairs such as pumps and filters.

It's primarily a one-man operation now, but T. J. said he does employ a couple of high schools boys during the summer.

He responded to several questions, one about salt water pools, which he recommends. Nancy Shelton noted that she has had a saltwater pool for 18 years with no problems. She also asked about his experience in removing mustard algae, which he said can be expensive.

learning with real-world application, business connections, and competitive events like case studies and role-plays, fostering skills in leadership, public speaking, and financial literacy for high school and college students worldwide.

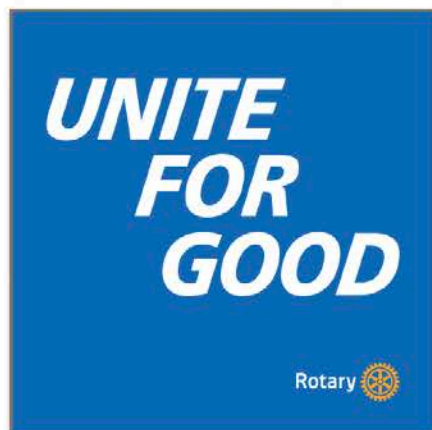
It's a co-curricular program where students apply knowledge through hands-on projects, networking, and competitions, developing essential professional and entrepreneurial skills for college and careers.
